Per the MMLA bylaws, faculty at all ranks are allowed and encouraged to submit their own name to be considered for the next Executive Committee election. To nominate yourself, please send a CV and a letter of interest to <a href="mailto:mmla@luc.edu">mmla@luc.edu</a> before <a href="mailto:january15">January 15</a>, 2025.

Nominees should be scholars who support the MMLA's mission to provide a forum for disseminating scholarship and improving teaching in the fields of literary and cultural criticism. Nominees do NOT need to be active members when nominated, as Executive Committee members will be given complimentary membership.

We are limiting the process to self-nomination only, but if you know of a colleague who would be well-suited for the role, please encourage them to put their own name forward.

### JMMLA Calls for Submission: Due Dates & Reminders

Submissions to the spring 2025 issue of the JMMLA on "Solidarity" are due January 15th, 2025.

The convention issue on "Health in/of the Humanities" will be accepting submissions until the fall of 2025, with a call for submissions to be posted early in the new year. The Midwest Modern Language Association Fellowship is a short-term opportunity for scholars working on projects in literary and cultural criticism. Applicants must be members of the Midwest Modern Language Association at the time of application and, if awarded, through the period of their fellowship.
