#### Wi-Fi Access

The MMLA's contract with the Hilton Chicago includes <u>free Wi-Fi</u>, which is intended to
enable presenters to access files stored remotely. To be on the safe side, however, we also
encourage you to pre-download those materials onto your computer so that they will be
accessible without the internet, in the unlikely case that an unexpected outage should
occur.

#### Printing Services

- For those who wish to print out a hard copy of their presentation at the hotel, there is a
   <u>Business Center</u> located in the lobby of the Hilton Chicago that offers free printing for
   Hilton guests only. A keycard is required to access the Business Center after 7:00 pm and
   to use its printing services.
- The Hilton Chicago also has an on-site <u>FedEx Print & Ship Center</u>, which offers self-service copiers to copy and/or print single- and multipage documents from the cloud, USB, or email. Copies start at \$0.20 for black and white and \$1.69 for color.

<u>December 1st, 2024</u> is the new deadline for article submissions to the Fall 2024 issue of the *Journal of the Midwest Modern Language Association*, "<u>Going Public</u>." This issue is an extension of the 2023 MMLA Convention theme, "Going Public: What the MMLA Owes Democracy," which asked participants what roles the humanities, especially modern languages and literatures, play in the public sphere. # Vote on the MMLA's Bylaw Change

The Midwest Modern Language Association seeks ratification by its members of a revision to the MMLA's Constitution, which was approved by the Executive Committee. Active MMLA members will soon receive an email message to which they may respond "yes" or "no" to approve or oppose this revision.

The revision in question adds language specifying a procedure for replacing an MMLA officer who vacates an office prior to the end of a term of service. The proposed language, to be added to section IV 2 of the <u>Constitution</u>, is the following:

If any officer resigns or is otherwise unable to continue serving as an officer, the vacancy shall be filled by a member of the Executive Committee, who shall be elected by majority vote of the remaining members of the Executive Committee.

We hope the information in this newsletter is helpful to all members who are planning on being a part of this year's MMLA Convention. We are excited to see all of our participants and attendees in Chicago very soon!
