Convention Deadlines & Reminders

Early-Bird Registration

Early-Bird Registration ends on <u>September 15th</u>! To avoid higher prices, register for the 2024 MMLA Convention before the deadline. Use the respective links for <u>Regular Member Registration</u> (full-time faculty and staff, administrators, school teachers, and librarians) or <u>Special Member Registration</u> (graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, part-time faculty and staff, as well as independent, unemployed, or retired members) to secure a spot at the convention.

Program Book Corrections

Corrections to the Convention Program Book must be made <u>no later than September 15th</u>. Attendees may search the <u>convention program book draft</u> to learn the day and time that panels and workshops have been scheduled. If you are participating in the convention, please look over this draft carefully to ensure your name, institution, and paper title(s) are listed correctly. If errors to this information are found, you may request a correction by emailing the MMLA at <u>mmla@luc.edu</u>. Please include "Program Book Correction" in the subject line and the following details in the body of the email:

- 1. The page number where the correction is needed
- 2. The erroneous text
- 3. The correct text

Graduate Student Paper Prize

The Graduate Student Paper Prize submission deadline is <u>October 15th.</u> This \$100 prize is open to all graduate students who have been chosen to present a paper at the convention, and the winning paper will be published in the Fall 2025 issue of the *Journal of the Midwest Modern Language Association*. The winning author will also receive a complimentary membership and registration to the next MMLA convention. To apply, send your CV and the accepted paper (3,000 word limit) to mmla@luc.edu.

Deadline for Member Hotel Discount

The Final Day to Reserve a Hotel Room at the Member Rate is October 22nd! Booking a room at the Hilton Chicago will be the most convenient choice for MMLA members coming from out of town for the convention, and these bookings help the MMLA meet its obligation to secure a minimum number of members staying at the hotel.
